## Alumnae Admissions Representatives (AARs): Julia Schmitz '03 and Michelle Badger '06

- Continuing weekly coordination calls with Marcia Thom-Kaley to coordinate AAR directions for cascading out to Regionals. Organizing AAR Regional Leads and City Leads for larger areas
- Will hold conference call soon to coordinate AARs leaders
- Signing up AARs for fairs. AARs will use Admissions Advocate to log contacts with students, review lists of fairs for coverage. Any AARs who have trouble logging into Advocate should route issues through their Regional leads and then to Julia / Michelle if needed for resolution.
- Continuing to work with AR&D and Admissions to identify and recommend software "quick fixes" / improvements for usability of Admissions Advocate.

- Continuing to organize to conduct a Class Officers Audit and beginning to draft a Class Officers
   Handbook to define the new model of extensive and enduring alumnae engagement with many alumnae
   per class involved in class leadership. Class Officers Handbook will clarify roles and responsibilities
   and provide tips and leading practices to make sure every class has a President / co-Presidents, Secretary /
   Secretaries for class notes, Social Media Secretary (or Secretaries), Fund Agent Team and Class
   Stewards.
- Will engage Flo Rowe Barnick '80, Dorsey Tillett Northrup '75, Norma Valentine '93, and Ann Kiley Crenshaw '76 to assist. Michelle Badger '06 to recommend some names from 00's and 10's to potentially support the Class Officers Audit.
- Also considering how to coordinate with 9 Decade Chairs/Co-Chairs (e.g., 40's, 50's, 60's, 70's, 80's, 90's, 00's, 10's) and Sister Classes (e.g., 20 years apart = 1956-1976-1996-2016)

- August 1-19<sup>th</sup> Sweet Work Days: Once again our alumnae were on-campus demonstrating "the Sweet Briar Effect" with 98 alumnae volunteering over three weeks to take on a number of "budget-relieving" projects selected and approved by SBC Buildings & Grounds and Alumnae Relations & Development, including painting, landscaping, and power-washing!
- Career Services Support: Barb Watts is very happy with the Alumnifire draft training proposal to engage more alumnae in supporting career advising, resumes reviews, and helping with identifying internships and jobs opportunities. She sent "the Network" Co-Chairs the schedule of upcoming Fall Career Services events and is excited at how much support she receives from alumnae volunteers.    Sweet Briar is among elite networks of alumni and that SBC is the highest ranking all-women's college and has a <a href="ratio of 15">ratio of 15</a> alumnae ready to help each student with internships, jobs and career mentoring. Current Alumnifire Statistics (as of August 21, 2016) 753 Vixens offering introductions and networking; 702 Vixens offering resume reviews and feedback; 677 Vixens offering informational interviews, 466 Vixens offering job shadowing, 387 at a company that is hiring, 188 Vixens interested in finding interns.

• **Lifelong Learning** – Beginning to consider possible training short courses that could be used to boost volunteerism (e.g., Alumnifire, Banner self-service reporting, Social Media platforms and communications among alumnae groups). Also exploring FreeConferenceCall.com (similar to WebEx, GoToMeeting, Adobe Connect, Zoom, etc.) as a platform to host webinars / teleconfs and record sessions which can be archived and reviewed later by interested alumnae. Intent is to use something that is easy, \$0 cost, completely alumnae driven and supported, and widely deployable for many AA needs.

- Land Use & Sustainability follow-up work later this academic year, when the College is ready to explore and pursue opportunities
