New Business, Other SBC News Highlights and AA Council Ongoing Operations

- Mary Pope Hutson thanked the AA and the working groups for their continuing work. She values the volunteer hours and the relationships we're helping to build. She said they still haven't finished counting all the dollars coming in and hopes to have numbers for the Board when they arrive on campus for the weekend. She said the AR&D staff had an 8-hour retreat and stressed the strong volunteer work from alums, ranging from reunion to club activities, from fundraising to internships. "There is no other college that has the kind of engagement that we do." She spoke about Sweet Work Weeks and the engagement of faculty and staff, as well as alums who have signed up to work this summer.
- Mary Pope said Meredith Woo, as part of a special initiative to refurbish the dorms, has asked that the college frame about 400 of the works of art in the college collection, so that every student can enter a lottery to have a work of art hanging in their room, as well as the parlors and open spaces. Mary Pope also said there is an

- initiative to refurbish Sweet Briar House, including a special task force of alums with expertise in historic preservation and design. Katherine Kilpatrick '74 has been heading the effort.
- Mary Pope says there will be a special admissions outreach plan involving AARs that will launch in early August. She said the college continues to work on enrollment through the summer.
- Mary Pope encouraged all AA council members to think about how to improve the Alliance and support the college. She is encouraged by everything that has been accomplished. She said they are looking at dates for a 14-16 city tour with President Woo from early September to November 15. The theme will be a new era, a new vision for Sweet Briar. President Woo will wrap up a strategic plan, which Mary Pope described as "thrilling," by the end of August.

Working Group Updates from the AA Council

Strategic Initiatives: Debra Elkins '93, Sarah von Rosenberg '72 and DeDe Conley '72

- Sarah von Rosenberg noted that the AA has been operating for under two years. She said the criteria for Plus-Ones are a skill set you want to share with the college, and a willingness to work co-operatively together with others in service to the College and its alumnae. Be thinking about priorities for the AA over the next six months. We welcome your input as you see things that need retooling. Please help us keep recruiting people to join these calls. Over the next two years we will be tweaking and refining the AA, especially governance and communications, to continue building out and defining what the "Sweet Briar effect" is. We will be helping alums (with areas of focus including clubs, networking, Alumnifire), but our priority has to be using our skill sets to help the college with recruiting students! Debra Elkins described it as a virtual organization that works together to not only help the college, but build volunteers' leadership skills.

Clubs and Virtual Auction: Cady Thomas '98 and Kathryn Yunk '91

- Are organizing the Back to School Days events, please make sure the word gets out because we know the data in Banner is not complete. Kathryn Yunk noted that the Back to School events are very casual, ice cream socials or cupcake gatherings, about a half dozen have been scheduled so far. We are including prospective students this year, as well as current students and alumnae. If you know anyone who would like to host one please let us know.
- Talbots event in May: we raised about \$7000; 26 clubs worked with Talbot's stores to host events. That was the largest event Talbot's has ever done, and SBC's first clubs national event of this type. Overall very successful to learn things in the SBC clubs and Talbot's partnership, for potential future events.
- Debra Elkins stressed that some of the data in Banner is not up to date. She and Sarah encouraged AA members to keep asking other alumnae if they are getting information from the college. If not, it could be

their Banner information is out of date. We always can help the College collect better information at club events and share with the AR&D to connect alumnae back to the College.

"The Network" and Career Development: Katie Schellhammer '95 and Sarah Clement '75

- **Sweet Work Weeks** –scheduled for July 31 August 18th
- Priscilla described heavy duty planning for Sweet Work Weeks. She said President Woo has prioritized the preparation of six dorms that will be in use next year. A lot of the flooring is being taken out now and replaced with new carpeting or hardwood floor. President Woo wants the residence halls painted during the first two weeks of Sweet Work Weeks, by Aug. 10. The sign up is live on the website under the alumnae tab (http://sbc.edu/alumnae-development/sweet-work-weeks/); so far about 100 volunteers have signed up. She urged members to encourage friends to come. Faculty and staff have also volunteered to help with the painting. This fits into President Woo's vision of "One Sweet Briar." Katie Schellhammer asked at what age children could participate. Priscilla said no younger than 16.
- **Kathy Pegues** working on projects and supply lists and organizing the Working Group with crew chiefs. If anyone has ideas, and wants to volunteer to help Kathy & team, contact Kathy Pegues '71

Plus Ones questions:

- What is happening with the Adopt a Vixen program? Student confidentiality/privacy concerns (covered by FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, see http://oldweb.sbc.edu/catalog/academic-procedures) limit the information that alumnae can receive about students. Idea presented that Clubs take this program on as Adopt a Residence Hall rather than an individual student, to conform with regulations on student privacy and confidentiality.
- What about the college art collection and art management if placed in student dorms? Friends of Art is assisting the College with art collection management, particularly framing art. The art framing effort is not part of Sweet Work Weeks!
