Council Operations: As appropriate, the Council will identify action items per teleconf, and coordinate with the College Alumnae Relations & Development Office (AR&D).

- AA Council will focus efforts toward "Alumnae Engagement, Students, and Money" to support AR&D. Council Co-Chairs will continue weekly teleconfs with AR&D.
- Keep the "4 P's" Passion for our alma mater, Professionalism, Patience, Perseverance

Staff Requests and Updates:

- **Barb Watts** updated the Council about a federal job fair, which drew 70 students participating from area colleges, including 23 Sweet Briar students. We had representatives and/or recruiters from 23 federal agencies, ranging from the FBI to the Peace Corps, as well as several military and defense agencies. It included a keynote address, several breakout sessions and opportunities to meet with representatives.
- She also described plans for a Washington, D.C., event at the start of spring break, that coincides with a job fair that Virginia Tech is hosting at their Falls Church campus. It will include a dinner with alums, a visit to Capitol Hill, a job fair and a possible networking event with Hampton Sydney. She also urged alums to update Alumni Fire to help seniors find jobs. She said that many alumnae are using Career Beam. Luther Griffith spoke about a Linked In event the following night. Barb described how she fills in for professors who have to miss class and spends the time talking to students about career opportunities.

- Mary Pope Hutson praised Barb and the alumnae in providing opportunities for students and young alumnae. She said that 15,000 alumnae magazines have been mailed out across the country and should be arriving in mailboxes soon, if they haven't arrived already. She said the magazine has been getting rave reviews and lauded Clelie Steckel, Jane Dure and Phyllis Watt Jordan for their work on the magazine.
- Mary Pope stressed that this is a key time for fundraising, the six-month mark. She also updated the Council on the progress on Giving Tuesday. By 11:30, they had reached \$53,000, half way toward the goal of \$116,000. The college is also hoping to secure 116 people who give monthly. Last year, more than \$1 million came through these recurring donations, which she added, count toward reunion giving.
- Mary Pope also announced that the annual tree lighting on Thursday, Nov. 30, would be livestreamed on Facebook Live so that all alumni can watch. She noted that there is another prospective student event over the weekend. She also said planning has begun for the February meeting of the Alumnae Alliance Council on campus.
- Claire Griffith reported that the most recent events on President Woo's tour—in Philadelphia and Norfolk—were very successful. More than 100 people turned out for the Norfolk event, and the bar lit up in pink and green. We had six class of 2016 graduates there with their mothers, who were recognized at the party. She thanks those who paid for and organized events. She said the development team also met with the Hampton Roads Community Foundation, which seems enthusiastic about working with Sweet Briar. The following day, President Woo spoke at Norfolk Academy about global issues, particularly the crisis with refugees. She was greeted with rousing applause. In summary, Claire said the tour ended on a high note. President Woo is planning to visit Foxcroft on Dec. 1.

Admissions Ambassadors: Michelle Badger '06 and Heather Ewing '90 (interim)

- **Heather Ewing** said the team is appreciative of alumnae making high school visits and have reports that those are going extremely well. Other alumnae are reaching out directly to students by making calls and writing personal notes, and encouraging them to visit the campus.
- Heather also noted that the December open house was a result of past open houses being sold out, another indication of interest in the college.
- Claire Griffith said the college is messaging that the tuition is \$21,000, rather than the full amount of \$34,000 that includes room and board.

Strategic Initiatives: Debra Elkins '93, Sarah vonRosenberg '72 and Sarah Clement '75 (interim)

- Nominations process for Council Co-Chairs is ongoing. Sarah Clement said that on an upcoming call, the Council will be talking about nominations and hoping to make decisions. There will also be posting for a new working group, as well as a representative to serve on the Board of Directors' Buildings, Grounds and Technology Committee. For the council, they have 24 nominations from the last 7 weeks for the co-chairs that are rotating off. Nominations were solicited using personal asks to serve, multiple Facebook postings, and 2 Briar Wire advertisements to fill Council seats for: (1) Co-Chair for Admissions Ambassadors, (2) Co-Chair for Clubs, (3) Co-Chair and Members for the Alumnae Alliance Council / Strategic Initiatives Governance Working Group, (4) Co-Chair for "The Network" and Lifelong Learning, and (5) Co-Chairs for Alumnae Communications Traditional and Social Media.
- The Council is also seeking nominations to serve as co-chairs / liaisons to the Development Working Group, and to serve as an Alumnae Alliance representative to the Board / Buildings, Grounds and Technology Committee.
- **Debra Elkins** said the Alumnae Alliance Council would meet on campus in February, with tentative dates from Feb. 22-24. She and Sarah vonRosenberg are taking ideas for what we should discuss in the Alumnae Alliance Council's annual report to the Board
- **Drafting recommendation to the Board / Alumnae Committee** to recognize the service of alumnae who helped establish the Alumnae Alliance Council since July 2015 and their partner Alumnae Relations Directors and Associate Directors, who were instrumental in rebuilding the Alumnae Alliance.
- Alumnae Alliance Council 6-Month Priorities (July to December 2017) Debra urged Council members and Plus Ones to review the AA Council priorities, which aim to direct resources to top areas of need when the College asks for assistance. Debra and Sarah V are working on the new priorities for the December 2017 to June 2018 time period.

- **Phyllis Jordan** described how the communications team is working with AR& D to promote Giving Tuesday and the Christmas tree livestream later in the week. She said they are hoping to get ahead of any faculty announcement on the core curriculum.
- **Phyllis** gave a shout to Amy Leigh Campbell for designing a Twitter frame for promoting Day of Giving. The Alumnae Communications group used a hashtag and meme for the prospective students visits to SBC. Expect something similar for the upcoming Day of Giving (Tuesday, November 28th).
