Debra and Sarah V will step down and become Plus Ones. The interim Co-Chairs will serve until a regular nominations process can be run later this Spring and the new successors selected. The Governance WG is currently finalizing a recommended formal nominations process as part of their work, to be presented to Council at the February meeting.
