Development Working Group: Cathy Foose '78

- In evaluating what worked in the past, AR&D is reviving for the first time in many years the practice of sending larger donors stewardship letters and an endowment report showing what their money was used to support.
- The new message for the Sweet Briar Fund is that when you give to the SB Fund you are investing in SBC's new academic curriculum.
- **Reunion Save-the-Date:** scheduled for June 1-3, 2018. 3's and 8's are celebrating 5-year milestone reunions; all classes are invited to "come home!"

Governance and Strategic Initiatives Working Group: Sarah Clement '75 and Katie Robertson '97

- Katie reported that the WG is finalizing the governing principles document so that it can be circulated to Council in advance of the February on campus meeting. The thinking is that the process should be transparent, sustainable and credible, since reestablishing trust of alumnae is paramount.
- The interim nominations process used to fill the three Operations co-chair vacancies worked well and provided lessons learned for the new process the WG is developing.
- WG did not benchmark any other schools in particular but rather took a common sense-based approach to ensure that the SBC AA governance process is credible and easy to understand whether you have been closely involved with the college in the last couple of years or are just thinking of becoming more active in AA now. The WG has a good mix of people of different backgrounds and we developed our recommendations based on best practices of other not-for-profit groups in combination with the new hub-and-spokes model for alumnae engagement developed in 2015.

Council Operations: Sarah Clement '75, Norma Valentine '93, Josie Beets '00 (*interim*)

Council Leadership Transition: Debra Elkins '93 and Sarah vonRosenberg '72 have begun transitioning Council leadership to the interim co-chairs, who have been confirmed as interim by the AA Council until such time as a full formal nominations and selection process is adopted and executed (expected Spring 2018). Sarah C, Norma and Josie will shadow Sarah V and Debra from now until the official transition, which will occur at the February on-campus meeting of the AA Council.
