Council Operations:

As appropriate, the Council will identify action items per teleconf, and coordinate with the College Alumnae Relations & Development Office (AR&D).

- AA Council will focus efforts toward "Alumnae Engagement, Students, and Money" to support AR&D. Council Co-Chairs will continue weekly teleconfs with AR&D.
- Keep the "4 P's" Passion for our alma mater, Professionalism, Patience, Perseverance
- AA Council meets biweekly via teleconf, alternating between Open Calls with Plus Ones and AR&D, and Working Calls with Council and AR&D. Next meeting, April 17, is an Open Call with Plus Ones invited to participate.

AR&D Updates and Requests for the Alumnae Alliance

- AR&D reported that we did not quite reach our goal of 2000 donors in March. Final numbers for our March Days of Giving are still being tabulated.
- Claire had to join the call late because President Woo was having her quarterly meeting with the college community in the Chapel at the same time as our AAC call. Pres. Woo announced that her senior cabinet is now in place and the transition period is now complete. The college's new CFO, Lori Husein, has begun working and will be on campus beginning in May. - Lynn Rainville is serving as Acting Dean and has orchestrated development of the new curriculum. Students will be signing up for classes in the new curriculum on Thursday (April 5). The revised course catalog will be posted on the college website by Friday (April 6). The new three-week short courses will NOT be open to alumnae this year but may be offered for enrollment by alumnae in 2019. There will not be a printed course catalog; there has not been a printed catalog in many years.
- So far there are more than 200 registrations for Reunion 2018 so we will have a good attendance. Early registration deadline is April 20, prices go up after that. There will be a la carte registration options again this year, including a day pass. Register online at http://sbc.edu/reunion/registration/
- Alumnae Alliance Festival (used to be called the "Engagement Fair" but has a new name) will be held on the Saturday of Reunion (June 2) at noon in the Quad.
- Council members should please let Rachel know if you are coming to Reunion and need housing so that dorm housing can be arranged if necessary. The Inn is totally booked for Reunion.
- Sweet Work Weeks dates are on the website now and will run from July 23 through August 10. Projects for this summer's Work Weeks have not yet been determined and will be posted later.
